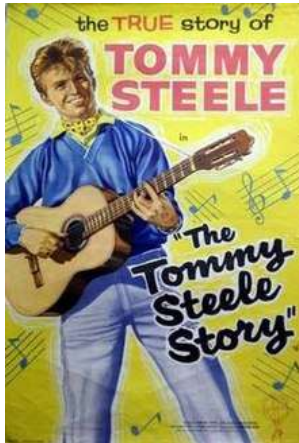

The Films, Locations and Pubs

Please meet at Bermondsey Jubilee Line station on Jamaica Road SE16 at 1300hrs from where we start off by following the old route of Jamaica Road westward, turning left down Thurland Road to find Fren Street on the right, a very different location to the one seen in 1957's *The Tommy Steele Story*. Returning the way we came and crossing Jamaica Road we walk along Bevington Street, featured in *One Wish Too Many* (1956) . . .

. . . to the corner of Bermondsey Wall East and Farncombe Street where **The Old Justice** stands, which was seen in *Give My Regards to Broad Street* from 1984.

Continuing eastward along the south bank of the River Thames we reach **The Angel** a Grade II listed public house that appears in *Inadmissible Evidence* (1968). Leaving The Angel, and following the line of Bermondsey Street, we soon reach the junction with Fulford Street at which a now isolated property seen in *Behemoth, the Sea Monster* (1959) still stands. Further along Rotherhithe Street is we pass a location that appears in *Terry on the Fence* (1985) and

A Fish Called Wanda (1988) before coming across **The Mayflower**. Formerly known as The Spread Eagle and Crown, this hostelry has featured in ***The Limping Man*** (1953), ***The Inn Way Out*** (1967) and ***One Wish Too Many***.

Leaving The Mayflower we continue along Rotherhithe Street until we reach number 364, a house seen in ***Jubilee*** (1978). On the way we cross the swing bridge over the entrance to Surrey Lock which we cross again by Salter Road bridge when returning to the corner of Brunel Road and Canon Beck Road, turning right to reach Albion Street where we find another location seen in ***One Wish Too Many***, the former **Lord Nelson** public house, now converted into flats.

How *The Ringer* saw St. Marychurch Street

Albion Street, Swan Road, Brunel Road past Rotherhithe station, keeping to the north side of Brunel Road we reach what was the junction of St. Marychurch Street and Paradise Street, now the south-eastern corner of Kings Stairs Gardens that appeared in ***The Ringer***. Following the old line of Paradise Street we reach what remains of the road and the corner of Cathay Street where the building which was once Rotherhithe police station, also seen in ***The Ringer***, still stands. Making our way to Jamaica Road we reach Bermondsey station.
